Importing references from PubMed Central (PMC) to RefWorks

In PMC,

- Select the references to be imported into Refworks.
- Click on **Send To** (upper right), then **File**, then in the FORMAT box select **MEDLINE**.
- Click on **Create File**. The file will be saved in the Downloads folder.

In RefWorks

- To import the references into RefWorks, select “**References**”, “**Import**” from the top menu bar.
- Select **NLM PubMed** as the Import Filter and **PubMed** as the database and select the text file you created
- Click **Import** and the references will be imported into RefWorks.
