Importing references from PubMed to RefWorks

In PubMed,

- Select the references to be imported into Refworks.
- Click on **Send To**, then **Citation Manager**, then choose the appropriate selection criteria.
- Click on **Create File**. The file will be saved in the Downloads folder.

In RefWorks

- To import the references into RefWorks, select “**References**”, “**Import**” from the top menu bar.
- Drag and drop the file created in you Downloads folder into the box provided.
- Click **Import** and the references will be imported into RefWorks.
