Importing references from PubMed to RefWorks

In PubMed,

- Select the references to be imported into Refworks.
- Click on Send To, then Citation Manager, then choose the appropriate selection criteria.
- Click on Create File. The file will be saved in the Downloads folder.

In RefWorks

- To import the references into RefWorks, select "References", "Import" from the top menu bar.
- Drag and drop the file created in you Downloads folder into the box provided.
- Click **Import** and the references will be imported into RefWorks.
